

Hanover City Council Special Meeting

May 18, 2020 at 6:00pm

The special Hanover City Council meeting was held May 18, 2020 at 6:00pm in the meeting room at the Firehouse at 201 S Railroad Street Hanover KS 66945.

Mayor Jared Sedlacek called the meeting to order at 6:00pm. Council members were Tony Bruna, Nick Rohr, Kim Lohse, Don Spencer, and Kylie Fritschi. Employees present were Katlin Bruna. Guests included Sarah Rippe, Ryan and Janine Doebele, and Jacob Fritschi.

1. The Hanover council listened to the concerns on the issue of the boy's baseball league. The concern was that there was not a representative from Hanover to go to baseball meetings for upcoming ball season and to help organize teams and coaches.
 - a. The council decided that the park and ball diamond committee which includes Kim Lohse, Tony Bruna and Nick Rohr would help represent Hanover for the baseball league.
2. The Hanover council discussed the opening of the pool for the 2020 season or to proceed with repairs.
 - a. Paddock Pool in Oklahoma City gave a cost of \$7500.00 and CES in Marysville KS gave a cost of \$8000.00—this cost would cover a full inspection of the pool and a design layout of costs of repairs.
 - b. Don made a motion to open the Hanover City Pool on July 1, 2020 unless the Governor changed her phases for reopening Kansas. The motion was declined due to no second to further discuss.
 - c. Tony made a motion, seconded by Kim to open the Hanover City Pool on June 20, 2020 unless the Governor changes her phases of reopening Kansas. Motion carried.
3. The council discussed pool manager and lifeguard applications.
 - a. Tony made a motion, seconded by Don to hire Heather Stallbaumer as the pool manager at \$800/month and \$7.85/hour if needed as a lifeguard. Motion carried.
 - b. Tony made a motion, seconded by Don to hire Cadlee Stallbaumer, Hannah Bruna, Avery Behrends, Julia Graff, Deja Atkins, Lyndee Padgett, Joshua Zarybnicky, and Ceagan Atkins as lifeguards at \$7.75/hour with a \$0.10 more each year they have worked and a \$0.50/hour more if they are WSI Certified. Motion carried.
4. The council discussed the senior banners hung on main street and the American flags. It was decided to allow the senior banners to remain on main street until after graduation and the city employees will hang the American flags the weekend of 4th of July.
5. The council discussed the Weecat Preschool having their graduation on June 7, 2020 at the Vet's Park. It was decided that the Weecat Preschool could have their graduation as long as social distancing is followed.
6. Tony made a motion, seconded by Don to adjourn the special meeting. Motion carried.






