

Hanover City Council Meeting  
June 9, 2021 at 5:00pm

The regular Hanover City Council meeting was held June 9, 2021 at 5:00pm in the meeting room at the Firehouse at 201 S Railroad Street Hanover KS 66945.

Mayor Jared Sedlacek called the meeting to order at 5:00pm. Council members present were Kim Lohse, Don Spencer, Tony Bruna, and Nick Rohr. Council member Kylie Fritschi arrived at 6:00pm. Employee's present were Katlin Bruna, Tim Koss, and Scott Wieden.

Guest included Austin Lawrence; Ernie Hroch and Stu Vitosh, Farmer's Coop; and Markus Frese, Frese CPA

1. Treasurer Report
  - a. Don made a motion, seconded by Kim to approve the monthly treasurer report. Motion carried.
2. Expenses
  - a. Don made a motion, seconded by Tony to approve the monthly expense report. Motion carried.
3. Minutes
  - a. Don made a motion, seconded by Nick to approve the regular and special meeting minutes. Motion carried.
4. Water Project
  - a. The council discussed the updates with the water project.
    - i. J&K Contracting has about 24% of the water mains in at the moment.
  - b. The council also discussed other options for funding for the city clerk to look into.
5. Street Department
  - a. Cell phone being disconnected.
    - i. Nick made a motion, seconded by Don to approve the purchase of a new phone and plan for the street department. Motion carried.
  - b. Jaedicke Bridge Culvert
    - i. Culvert is plugged. Clerk is to send out bid letters for sealed bids.
6. Water Department
  - a. Nick made a motion, seconded by Tony to approve the resolution for establishing specific requirements for constructing, reconstructing, or repairing an existing sewer system in the City of Hanover. Motion carried.
  - b. Nick made a motion, seconded by Kim to approve the resolution for providing for the adoption of tax and securities compliance procedures relating to obligations issued and to be issued by the City of Hanover for the temporary funding for the water project. Motion carried.
7. Council
  - a. Proclamation for Don Landoll Day and Sign
    - i. The council discussed proclamation and sign for Don Landoll; it was decided that they would make April 17 a proclamation day for Don Landoll as that day is his birthday.
  - b. Proclamation for Championships from the Hanover High School
    - i. The council discussed having a proclamation for all the state champions from Hanover High.
      1. Girls—Volleyball
      2. Boys—Football, Basketball, and Track
  - c. City Hall Office Equipment

- i. The council discussed putting the unused office equipment on the Highway 36 garage sales.
  - d. City Wide Garage Sale Review
    - i. Many citizens brought in the concern of changing the weekend of garage sales to the weekend before Memorial Day this year and how it was not well liked.
    - ii. The council decided to continue doing it on Memorial Day weekend again next year.
  - e. Review Delinquent Dogs/Cats
    - i. The council approve sending the list of delinquent dogs/cats over the City attorney office.
    - ii. Nick made a motion, seconded by Kim to approve changing Ordinance 662 to state that a household can have 5 pets in any combo.
  - f. Christmas Party
    - i. In December, the council postponed the Christmas party due to COVID.
      - 1. Don made a motion, seconded by Kylie to get together at Little Blue Bar and Grill sometime in July for the Christmas Party. Motion carried.
  - g. Kloppenberg A/C
    - i. The A/C at the Kloppenberg Center went out and needs to be repaired.
      - 1. Kim made a motion, seconded by Don to approve the estimate from Hanover Electric for \$2230.01 to repair the A/C. Motion carried.
- 8. Austin Lawrence
  - a. Austin discussed with the council the cameras that were installed and where to install the remaining cameras.
- 9. Buildings and Properties
  - a. Property Inspections
    - i. The council reviewed the property inspections. All inspections will be re-evaluated in the next couple weeks.
  - b. Tennis Court Bid
    - i. The council opened a bid from Torrey Bros for the fixing of the tennis courts for \$69,000. The council did not approve this bid.
  - c. Community Building
    - i. The council discussed the Chamber using the water at the pool to supply water for the campers for the carnival crew.
    - ii. The council reviewed the 2022 Chamber-City agreement. All looked good and can be sent to Chamber to review and sign.
- 10. Parks and Rec
  - a. Pool Hours and Operations
    - i. The council discussed whether to allow the pool to open at 11am. The clerk is to review the cameras to see how many kids there were from 11-1 and let the council know.
    - ii. Hours can stay 11-6 for the time being.
- 11. Markus Frese, Frese CPA
  - a. The council discussed the upcoming budget meeting that will take place in August.
    - i. Some changes that need to be made on this year's budget is budgeting for a third maintenance person to start training.
    - ii. The council always discussed whether or not they want to increase the mill levy—tabled for more discussion.
- 12. Parks and Rec Continued
  - a. Baseball Fields
    - i. Don made a motion, seconded by Nick to approve ordering 6 signs (2 for each field) from Barco that state "NO HITTING AGAINST FENCE". Motion carried.
    - ii. The council discussed coaches bypassing the ballfield manager after being told not to play on a field because of weather or them being to wet to play.
