Cancer Screening Updates

These days there are so many treatment options available for cancer. Along with these new treatment developments and patients being proactive in their screenings, cancer survival rates are increasing! The goal of cancer screening is to detect cancer before symptoms start--this drastically increases survival. There are 5 different types of cancers that your primary care provider (PCP) should help you screen for: breast, colon, cervical, prostate, and lung. Screening guidelines change, here are the most current recommendations according to the American Cancer Society.

Breast: Begin at 40 and continue every year until life expectancy is less than 10 years. For higher risk individuals a breast MRI may be necessary. Patients at higher risk are those with a family history, those with dense breasts, those with family members that have the BRCA gene—visit with your PCP to determine if a breast MRI is a better option for you.

Colon: Start at age 45 and continue until at least 75. Those with a family history of colon cancer will need to have a colonoscopy, but if you're at average risk, then a Cologuard test might be right for you! Ask your PCP about options. A Cologuard test should be done every 3 years and a colonoscopy every 10—as long as results keep coming back negative for cancer.

Cervical: Start at age 25 and continue until age 65. These guidelines changed in 2020. Cotesting is now recommended in place of a plain pap smear. Cotesting combines the pap test with an HPV test and is recommended every 5 years. Visit with your PCP on how to transition over to this new type of testing.

Prostate: Start at age 50 and continue every year until life expectancy is less than 10 years. Men with one relative with prostate cancer should start at age 45. Men with more than one relative with prostate cancer should start at age 40.



Lung: Current smokers and those who have quit in the past 15 years and fall between the ages of 50 and 80 are encouraged to screen for lung cancer. Your PCP can help you figure your “pack years” and help you determine if you should be screened.

Additional Tips:

- *Be timely and proactive with screenings—there are very few things worse than finding a cancer diagnosis and realizing you could have caught it earlier. Scheduling your annual visit in your birthday month might help you remember!
- *If you’ve had a screening and haven’t seen results, call your clinic and ask for results. Never assume that “no news is good news” when it comes to screenings.
- *Skin cancer and endometrial cancer screenings may also be appropriate—talk to your PCP.
