## March is Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month By Jayda Edgar, DNP, APRN, FNP-C

Did you know that colorectal cancer is the 3<sup>rd</sup> most common cancer diagnosed in both men and women? Due to this, starting colorectal cancer screening has moved up from 50 years of age to 45. You may be at higher risk of getting colorectal cancer if you have had precancerous polyps, been diagnosed with inflammatory bowel disease or have a family history of colorectal cancer. Many dietary and lifestyle risk factors that we are predisposed to here in the Midwest can increase your risk as well including lack of physical activity, a diet low in fruits and vegetables, a low-fiber/high-fat diet, being overweight and alcohol and tobacco use.

Signs and symptoms to monitor for and report immediately are a change in your stool habits, blood in your stools, abnormally dark stools, abdominal pain/cramps that do not go away or unexplained weight loss, among others. Fortunately, there are other screening options out there rather than a colonoscopy. While colonoscopies remain the gold standard for screening and identifying colon cancer, there are tests that can be sent straight to your home for you to perform and send back. This test is more commonly known as Cologuard. Cologuard is a great option for those at average-risk for colorectal cancer. There are other stool-based options done on an annual basis as well.

Please, do not wait until you are having symptoms be checked. Call your healthcare provider today to schedule an appointment to discuss the best screening option for you.

The Hanover City Council meeting was held March 12, at 6:00pm in the meeting room at the Firehouse at 201 S Railroad Street Hanover KS 66945.

Mayor Jared Sedlacek called the meeting to order at 6:00pm. Council members present were Kim Lohse, Scott Jueneman, Nick Garber, Don Spencer, and Coby Sedlacek. Employees present were Katlin Bruna and Melissa Minge. Employee Scott Wieden were absent. Guest include Shawn Minge, Fire Chief, and Stephen Griffiee.

1. Treasurer's Report
  - a. Don made a motion, seconded by Nick to approve the February 2023 treasurer report. Motion carried.
2. Expenditures
  - a. Don made a motion, seconded by Kim to approve the February 2023 expenditures. Motion carried.
3. Minutes
  - a. Don made a motion, seconded by Kim to approve the February 2023 regular and special meeting minutes. Motion carried.
4. Shawn Minge, Fire Chief
  - a. Reported that they had a training day on March 4, 2023 at the Farmer's Coop and also smoked up a old house to train; new radios will be beginning; there is a storm spotters meeting in April; applying for the Forestry grant again this year.
5. Street Department
  - a. City Wide Clean Up—will be May 4-6, 2023 which is the same weekend as the County Free Dump Days. There will be roll off dumpster parked in the lot south of Ricky's Café. Citizens are encouraged to take bigger items to the landfill if they are able to try and prevent the roll off dumpsters from filling up so fast.
  - b. Dumpsite Resolution
    - i. Don made a motion, seconded by Scott to approve the dumpsite resolution (Resolution 1-2023). Motion carried.
  - c. Patch Material
    - i. Don made a motion, seconded by Nick to approve the purchase of 250 tons of patch material. Motion carried.
  - d. Property Evaluations
    - i. The council reviewed the list properties that the code enforcer had; city clerk is to start letters to send out.
6. Water Department
  - a. CIPP Sewer Lining
    - i. Mayer contacted the city office in regards to the sewer lining project to discuss if they had a price in mind that would work in the budget to do the lining. The council would like to have Mayer attend the April meeting.
7. Summer Job Openings
  - a. Tabled to the April meeting.
8. Council
  - a. 2023 Elections
    - i. Positions up for Elections
      1. Mayor and two (2) council members: 4 year term
      2. One (1) council member: 2 year term
9. Adjourn
  - a. Nick made a motion, seconded by Don to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried.
